The Interfaith Amigos

By the time you read this, the Interfaith Amigos will have come and gone from Alpena. We don't yet know the response to their visit. What I do know is the absolutely fascinating journey it has been to bring them here and all the things to make it happen.

I volunteered to head up the marketing and publicity for their visit. What I know are the new things I have been exposed to and learned during the course of this project. Early in the year, I visited with Jackie Kcrawzak, President and CEO of the Chamber of Commerce and Mary Beth Stutzman President and CEO of the Convention and Visitors Bureau. The very daunting information I was given in that meeting was the old business maxim that it takes 7 exposures to a product/service/company to create a customer was just that old. Recent research suggests 9 to 12 exposures is now required I was told.

Then they told me that publicity should start 3 or more months out. The aim was for 1 exposure every other week. Then move to 1 new exposure each week. Finally reach several media exposures each week of the last few weeks.

Wow. That's a lot of publicity in the broadest sense of the word. This couldn't just be advertising in our case. Trying to think of all the ways we could reach people within our resources was challenging. It ended up including: posters around town, newspaper articles about the events leading up to the actual visit, brochures that could be picked up, a facebook site that people could like and friend so their friends would know about it, articles and announcements in church newsletters, bulletins and websites, announcements during worship services, big signs at the sides of roads, contacting peace and interfaith groups around the state, community book discussions, promoting it for book club reads, placement on community calendars, sending emails out to possibly interested groups or individuals, distributing information at regional church meetings, mailing packets of flyers and brochures to libraries in the area and word of mouth. We did finally use newspaper, radio, and web advertising.

I learned there is a specific format for press releases that you send to news organizations. And even a special way to do it in emails.

I learned there is grant money available from a variety of sources for projects like this. And that organizations far from our area, as in down state, would support efforts up north. One granting organization said the maximum you could apply for was \$500. So of course that was what was applied for. They granted \$1000. The financial support for this project came from 12 different sources including Grace Lutheran.

I really learned that a committed and dedicated group of people could do quite a lot. An amazing amount actually!

I learned a whole lot of people have curiosity and are looking toward a blessed and brighter future for the world.

Hearned a lot.

Items needed are: cotton t-shirts (not onesies), long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet), receiving blankets (medium weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square), cloth diapers (flat fold preferred), diaper pins, jacket, sweater or sweatshirt or include a baby cap, socks, dark hand towels, two or three bath-size bars of gentle soap (no mini or hotel-sized bars). All items should be

new or in good condition. Gently used, clean clothes (no tears or stains) can be substituted for new ones. There will be a pack and play by the door to put items into.

FRIENDSHIP WALL HANGING


Make this with — and for — a special friend.

What you need:

- Paper and pencil
- Scissors
- Cardboard
- Aluminum foil
- Tape
- Acrylic paint (red, blue, green)
- Paintbrushes
- Permanent marker
- Twine
- A friend

What you do:

- 1. Trace a palm-sized heart in the center of the paper. Cut out the heart to use as a stencil.
- 2. Cover the cardboard with foil. Tape the heart stencil in the center.
- 3. Fill in the heart "hole" with red paint. Let dry. Remove stencil.
- 4. Cover your hand with blue paint, and make a hand-print to one side of the heart. Cover your friend's hand with green paint and have him or her make a handprint to the other side of the heart. Let dry.
- 5. Write "FRIENDS" at the top.
- 6. On the back, tape twine to make a hanger.
