
The world separates and divides. Builds walls. Says good and bad on different sides. And those with vision to see, get some glimpses of God's vision, seeing one family of God. The great shalom.

#### **GRACE LUTHERAN POTLUCK &** MINI-GOLF WAS A HUGE SUCCESS!





#### World Vision "Sponsor a Child" Program



## Update of National Youth Gathering in Detroit July 2015

Thanks to both congregations for the wonderful support of this amazing group of youth and adults who attended ELCA National Youth Gathering in Detroit (July 15-19). We all came home with an intense sense of service and awareness of social justice issues – including racism, poverty, homelessness,

and gender inequalities. It will be our mission to keep caring conversations going and take an active role in helping with awareness on many fronts for our Youth Ministry Year 2015-16.

Many of the artists and speakers were inspirational, shocking, and "real" – sharing small portions of their stories in order to shake us up and realize that we are all called by God to do many special things in this world. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton said it best, "We do not have to save the world. It has already been done for us in Jesus Christ." We are not to sit with complacency anymore and avoid discussing or sharing the hard issues in life. We are called to be light and salt for the earth – so, please consider coming along side us this year as we talk, share, and learn how we fit in to these areas.

I am blessed to see these youth take on and speak of things they are very passionate about. At the ELCA Gathering we saw many responses and pro-active efforts to care for our hurting world. Here is some of the current statistics and efforts that happened during our time in Detroit:

- Estimated \$28-\$30 million was filtered into the economy of Detroit
- 100 blocks were transformed (through Proclaim Justice/service efforts)
- 500 tires removed
- 1,000 lots cleared
- 100 homes boarded up
- 20 acres mowed
- 180 partnering organizations continuing the work in Detroit
- 72 newly installed Urban Gardens
- Hygiene kits put together
- Fleece hats made
- 607 pints (78.8 gallons) of blood donated
- Hair donations (650 people donated at least 8" of hair. That's a minimum of 433 feet!) to children with hair-loss (2 of our youth donated over 18 inches)
- Over \$400,000 raised in Walk for Water campaign
- More than 591,917 diapers collected

Our Alpena group was blessed to work on our Proclaim Justice Day with Rippling Hope. Here are some statistics the pastor shared with us on what was accomplished in 3 days of service work with them:

• 1530 ELCA youth worked on their sites, 13 Methodists, & 25 First United Church of Christ

#### youth

- Youth from 22 different states
- Transformed 12 of their neighborhoods via clearing walkways for youth headed to school, cleared around abandoned homes, piled trash, piled lawn debris, and helped many of the neighborhoods come together for a common purpose of HOPE

We all are forever changed by taking time to think about Our Story, The World's Story and God's Story. We proclaimed Story (with our NWLM Synod Family), we Proclaimed Community (at COBO Hall activities), and we Proclaimed Justice (out in the neighborhoods of Detroit). We look forward to bringing what we learned with us into our church family & our community this year.


