



[¹My friends, if anyone is detected in a transgression, you who have received the Spirit should restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness. Take care that you yourselves are not tempted. ²Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. ³For if those who are nothing think they are something, they deceive themselves. ⁴All must test their own work; then that work, rather than their neighbor's work, will become a cause for pride. ⁵For all must carry their own loads. ⁶Those who are taught the word must share in all good things with their teacher.] ¹Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. ⁶If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh; but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit. ⁵So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. ¹⁰So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith. ¹¹¹See what large letters I make when I am writing in my own hand! ¹²It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that try to


compel you to be circumcised—only that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. ¹³Even the circumcised do not themselves obey the law, but they want you to be circumcised so that they may boast about your flesh. ¹⁴May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. ¹⁵For neither circumcision nor uncircumcision is anything; but a new creation is everything! ¹⁶As for those who will follow this rule—peace be upon them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God.

Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near." ¹⁶"Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me." ¹⁷The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" ¹⁸He said to them, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. ¹⁹See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. ²⁰Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."






Remembering, therefore, his death, resurrection, and ascension, we await his coming in glory.





Hello Grace Lutheran!

I apologize for the delay in updates. It has been a very turbulent semester and beginning of summer. First, I would like to say thank you to everyone who sent me mail and gifts. I loved reading your notes, I promise to write you a personal letter!

Second, an update about school. I am still a part-time student and will continue on this path until I finish my academic requirements before my internship. I am also not doing Clinical Pastoral Education this summer. I have been discerning my call to serve in a hospital or a nursing home, and I would like to grow more in my faith before I take on such an emotionally taxing yet incredibly rewarding experience. I know that as soon as I make plans, God laughs. But I also know that God is guiding me to listen to myself, to take my time and be patient. I have had to change a lot of my own expectations of myself and of school. More than once I've had to take a step back to let God take care of it.

Third, overall. Seminary is incredibly, terribly, wonderful. It has been hard, but I would not trade my first year for the world. I have grown so much as a person spiritually, and surprisingly retained more knowledge than I thought. I look forward to my classes next semester; New Testament 1, Islam, Youth and Young Adult Ministries, and Choir.

Now that I have completed my first year, I have a better idea of how to handle this upcoming school year. Time management was a tough lesson to learn, but I feel much more confident now that I understand the flow of school.

This summer I am traveling to Germany for two weeks with some Trinity Alumni. I was invited on scholarship to come along. We will be visiting the places where Luther preached, taught, lived, and died, as well as visiting the Buchenwald Memorial, and rounding off the trip with the Passion Play in Oberammergau. The Passion Play has been celebrated every ten years since the 1600s. I am so excited for this once in a lifetime experience, and I am so grateful to have been invited. I will be sure to dedicate a letter just to that experience in the upcoming weeks!

Thank you so much for your continued support and prayers. I cannot tell you how much I appreciate you all and how thankful I am that you are all walking with me on this journey.
