From Your Synod Assembly Representative


Hello Members of Grace Lutheran Church,

I really didn't know what to expect for my first time at the North/West Lower Michigan Synod Assembly. I was there for two reasons: 1- To see my friend Vicki Denstaedt receive recognition for completing the Equipping Leaders for Mission and Ministry program (ELMM), and 2- As a voting member, tasked this year with filling a few positions on the Synod Council, and electing a Bishop (among other things). Truthfully, had it not been for Vicki's recognition, I would not have been there. She has a way of 'gently' pushing me to do things that I wouldn't consider on my own. (Thank you Vicki!) So it was Vicki who suggested Paul Denstaedt and I as the two representatives from Grace Lutheran Church, and I somewhat reluctantly agreed to it! I say reluctantly only because I really had no clue what I was getting myself into. But as it got closer to the start of the Synod Assembly, I was really looking forward to going.

It was, on some level, exactly what I was expecting. If you've ever served on a church council, or been a board member for any organization, you're familiar with the business end of things: reports, discussion, decisions, voting, etc. All of those 'things' involved in conducting the business or decision making end of whatever organization you are representing. Well, the Synod Assembly is exactly that, but on a somewhat larger scale... decisions here affect Grace Lutheran and over 100 other churches. That's a big job! I really appreciated the honor given to me as a representative of Grace, and while there I had a strong sense of wanting to do a good job (aka don't mess this up!), especially when it came to the election of a Bishop—and that process was pretty intense. It took 5 rounds of voting (6 if you count the one round that was invalidated and thrown out) to re-elect Bishop Satterlee to a second term. There really is no way to fully explain what it was like being at the Synod Assembly, but I thoroughly enjoyed the experience. It was

nice to have a voice; to be able to participate in decisions that affect not only our church, but every other church in the N/WLM Synod as well. It was also nice to see a few familiar faces (from The Gathering I attended with the youth group) as well as talk to some new people.

I honestly didn't really expect to get anything out of it personally, but I did! While there, I did a lot of listening and thinking. There were speeches from the top 8 nominees for Bishop (many of them talked about answering the call and following where God leads them), a Q&A session with the top 3 nominees, as well as presentations from various programs like the ELMM program that Vicki participated in, the Living Stones initiative from Bishop Satterlee, and one on becoming a Reconciling in Christ church (which openly welcomes the LGBTQ community). I also had the opportunity to talk to a few people at booths set up for several programs such as the ELMM, Living Water Ministries, World Hunger, etc. As I listened, I truly found myself wondering what is it that God calls



me to do. And, just exactly what is a calling anyway? (So, I looked it up...CALLING: a strong inner impulse toward a particular course of action especially when accompanied by conviction of divine influence).

Only a few people know that I decided to join Grace Lutheran Church when my daughter Caileigh was down in Detroit at the National Gathering with Vicki, Miriam, and Isabelle Denstaedt (among others). I wasn't able to go, but they streamed many of the Gathering speakers online, so I was able to watch from home. I always felt like Grace chose us by happenstance—Caileigh became friends with Isabelle in junior high, and from that point on Caileigh was invited to any and all youth group activities. We then attended a few worship services, BUT... at first I didn't think Grace was for me... seriously, there is NO contemporary music here! I had previously attended Living Hope Church which does have contemporary music, but was lacking in other areas for me. Anyway, it was during the National Gathering that I truly listened to what God was saying to me, and I realized that the ELCA and Grace Lutheran was exactly what I needed. Everything that I heard in the speeches that day, spoke to me, and made me realize that my thoughts and beliefs directly aligned with the ELCA. I told myself to quit searching for "something" because I had clearly already found it. I was home!

As for the Synod Assembly, it was truly a great experience, and if given the opportunity to attend again I would. I would also encourage everyone else to volunteer for the chance to go. I am sure your experience would be vastly different than mine, but I feel that everyone would get something out of it. The next North/West Lower Michigan Synod Assembly will be May 14-16, 2020 in Mt. Pleasant. Thank you for allowing me to represent Grace Lutheran Church this year!

Something we are trying this year is collecting toiletries for the students so they don't have to spend part of the 200.00 on these items. We are asking area churches to help with this, Grace is one. We would like to collect

these items for the students and then distribute on the day of shopping. The extra stuff will be given to the school success workers and then handed out throughout the year.

You are encouraged to take a tag or two and shop for those items. Anything to help these kids feel good and encourage them to go to school, supply them with what they need to do well and stay in school is helpful.


